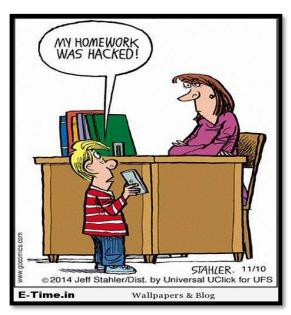

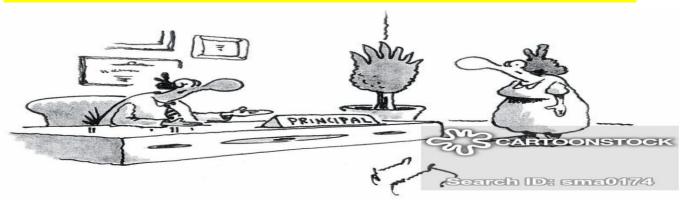

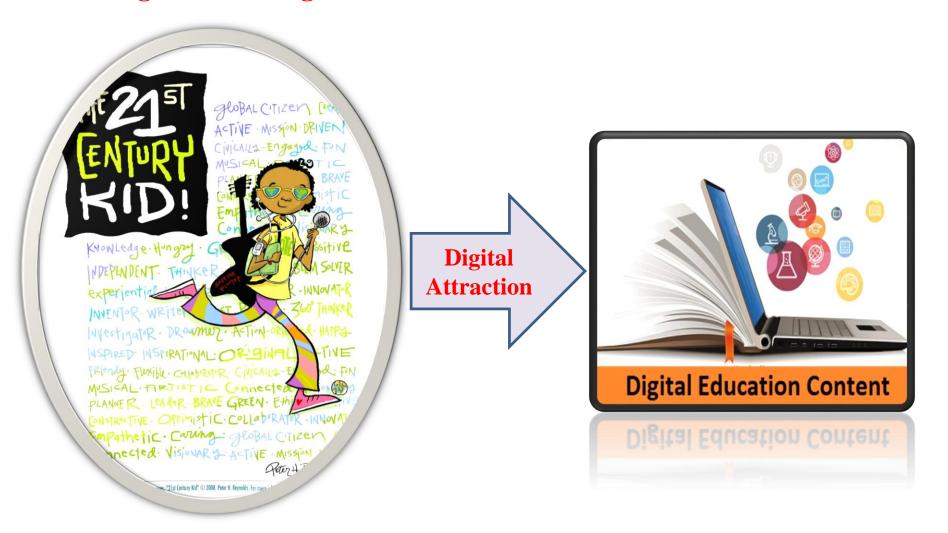

SKILLS 21ST CENTURY TEACHERS MUST ACQUIRE

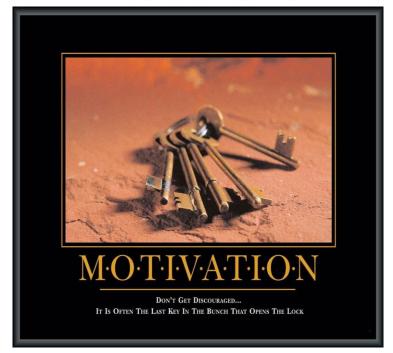
- 1- Create and edit digital audio

- 3- Use blogs and wikis to create online platforms for students
- 4- Exploit digital images for classroom use
- 5- Use video content to engage students
- 6- Use infographics to visually stimulate students
- 7- Use Social networking sites to connect with colleagues and grow professionally
- 8- Compile a digital e-portfolio for their own development
- 9- Be able to detect plagiarized works in students assignments
- 10-Create screen capture videos and tutorials
- 11- Curate web content for classroom learning
- 12- Use and provide students with task management tools to organize their work and plan their learning
- 13-Use polling software to create a real-time survey in class
- 14- Use digital assessment tools to create quizzes
- 15- Find and evaluate authentic web based content

To motivate the teachers and students, the digital education content must be tailored to create digital attraction.

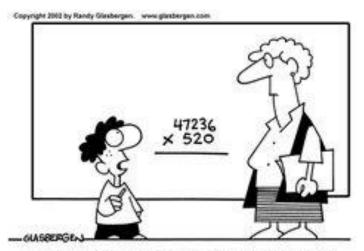

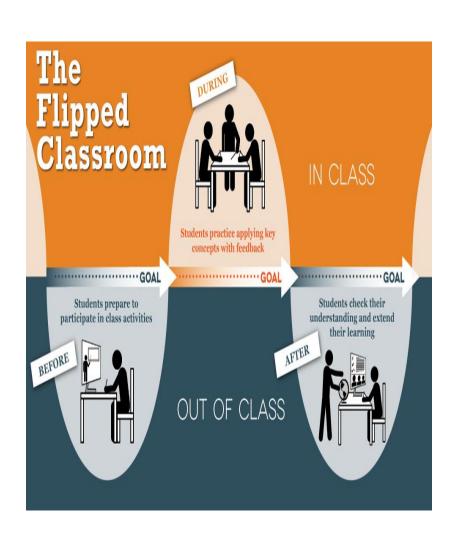


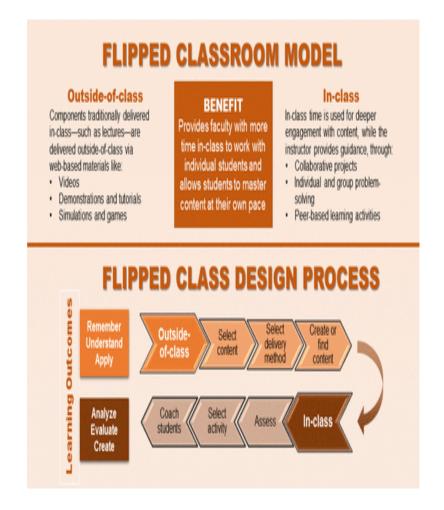


How reliable and valid is online testing?

Advantages of the flipped classroom in virtual training

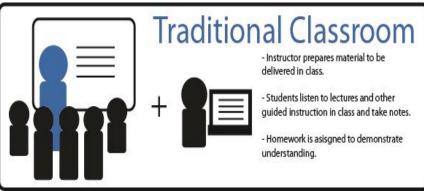
COVID-19 flipped the whole education system

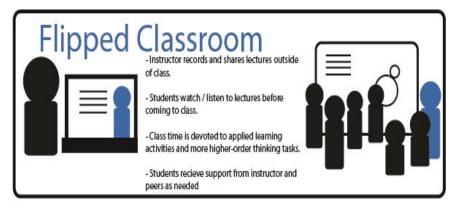


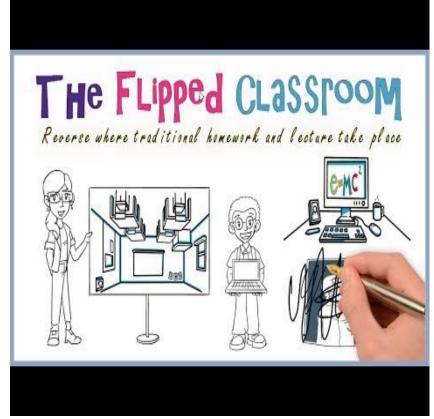

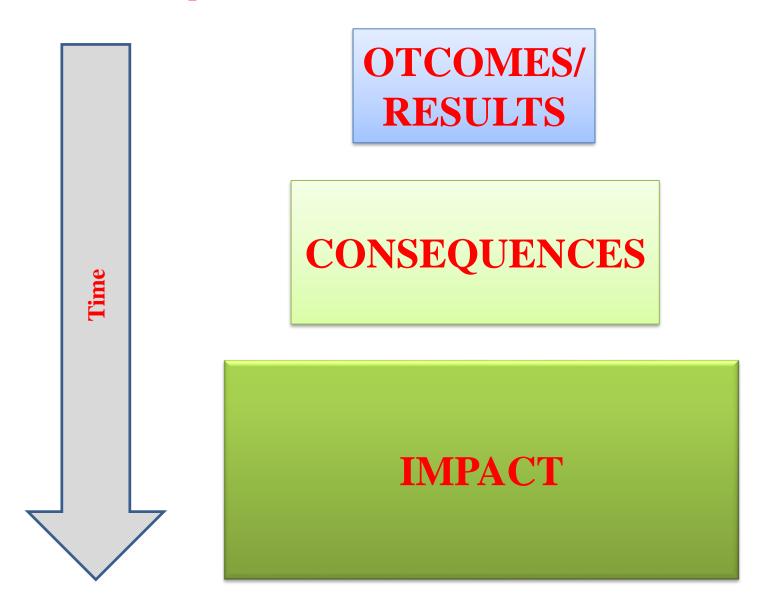








Comparison of results of real vs. virtual classrooms

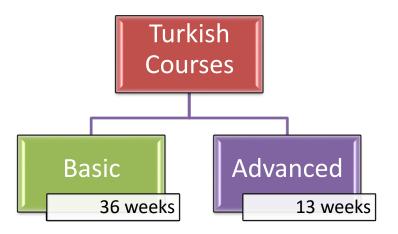

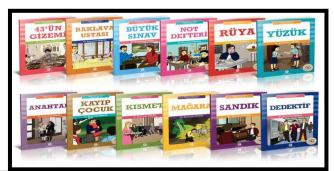

ONLINE TEACHING EDUCATION DURING THE PANDEMIC

How did we do it?

Try-out period: April 17-22 2020

Application period: April 27 – September 25 2020

Participants: Basic Turkish Course students & Advanced Turkish Course students

Softwares used: Big Blue Button (BBB) and Perculus

Time (Hours): 780 hours

Course Material: Digital version of the course book







OUR EXPERIENCE

Based on our online experience, for the <u>basic course</u>, it is advised that, if there is a way, language education should be done <u>face to face</u>. Our justification for this can be summarized as follows:

- to avoid possible negativities that can be faced at the outset such as concentration, motivation...
- the teacher effect (touching students)
- to provide precise guidance to the students when they need the most
- to help maintain the newly acquired information by engaging them during class time
- to occupy them with ample activities that can foster their language learning
- to take advantage of living in the country where the native language is used
- Field trips, contact with the natives, taking advantage of the language by living in the native country such as learning culture, customs and colloquial use etc...
- immerse the students into a kind of language shower

CHALLENGES

- Pandemic related anxiety had negative effects on students academic performance and motivation
- Very limited social interaction between students and the teachers
- Very limited discussions among the students
- Technical and technological infrastructural problems
- Online era is still very young and has not established itself yet as a well-defined field of study and research
- It is more costly than traditional education
- Some students do not posses the digital devices for utilizing the wide spectrum of the distance education
- Lack of necessary technology, internet accessibility and online resources

ONLINE TEACHING DURING THE PANDEMIC

However, to our experience, Online Education, which has become more important during the Covid-19 pandemic, is not an alternative to conventional education; but, rather, a supporting figure. It should be noted that not all cirricula or teaching activities can be replaced by online courses. We still continue to integrate online education to our facilities in our school.

CONCLUSION



Different modalities of education should not exclude each other, but should complement each other

No matter how developed the technology is, the moment when teacher and students are face to face is the most valuable moment. A face is much better than an interface; and an interface is much better than no face

The distance between the teacher and the student can be much more than in the distance education; in education, it is the perceived distance that matters.

The burden on teacher's shoulders is more in distance education.

It is better to learn with technology rather than from technology.

No mode of education is totally problem and risk free; there is no swiss-knife education model

CONCLUSION

Teaching and learning are already complicated, teaching and learning with technology is much more complicated.

Virtual teachers and virtual classrooms can not fully replace real teachers and real classrooms.

Existence of online education does not 100 % guarantee motivation, but non-existence of online education 100 % guarantees demotivation.

Testing is the weakest link of the chain in distance education.

Nowadays, teachers, students and educators are adapting to the «new normal» with education from a distance. Online education can change the whole future scenario in education.

Provided the challenges experienced by the teachers and students are well explored and transformed to opportunities, online teaching can have a great impact on reaching large audiences decreasing the cost of language teaching in long terms, creating equality on opportunities and facilities, and providing educators with field and theoretical knowledge.

Now it is time to seize upon this opportunity to make constructive changes in our educational systems.

International coopereation has become easier and «a must» in this new period.
